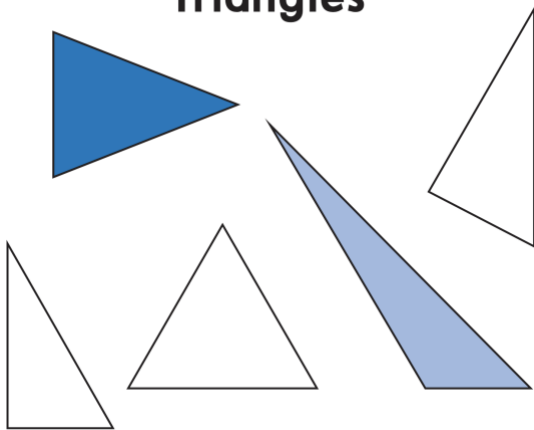


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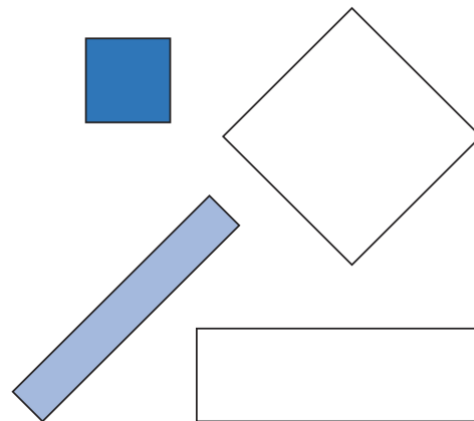
Shape Search at Home

Shapes are all around us! Explore and discuss shapes with your child, making sure to look for and talk about lots of *different* kinds of triangles and rectangles, such as the ones pictured below. Encourage your child to look around the house or out the window to find things that are different shapes (e.g., triangle roofs, rectangle tables and square windows). Or, make your shape search a game of *I Spy*. For example, “I spy with my little eye a triangle on the toy shelf.” Children can draw what they find below. Help them label their drawings (e.g., circle clock, triangle clock, etc.).
